# TWCCTW Project: Dental Program in Rural Cambodia

Together We Can Change The World (TWCCTW) has provided a grant to the Cambodia Community Dream Organization(CCDO), to establish a dental program for school children in rural Cambodia near Siem Reap.

The grant benefits more than twenty primary schools and over 5,000 children.

TWCCTW Board Member Steve Tillis, a retired dentist, screened over 120 children. 80 percent had visual dental decay, and a significant number were in pain.

The first part of the program involves establishing a dental hygiene program in the schools. Teachers are trained to teach and provide preventative dental hygiene.

The students are taught about the need for good oral hygiene. Each school day the students, under supervision, brush their teeth with toothbrushes provided through the grant.

The second part of the program is dental screening by a trained dental professional at each school. Children who are in pain or have severe dental needs are taken to the Siem Reap Hospital Dental Clinic for the necessary dental treatment.

This dental program has been a tremendous success in eliminating dental pain and establishing a preventative dental hygiene program to help eliminate future dental disease and keep children from becoming dental cripples at a young age.



# **Uniforms for Hope**

Maureen Maloof, founder of Uniforms for Hope, and her sister Dr. Catherine Maloof with a little help from TWCCTW, provided 1,000 Uniforms for the Cambodian Community Dream Organization (CCDO) - one of TWCCTW's favorite causes.





The materials were bought and sewn in Cambodia providing jobs for local women.



# Clean Water Water Water Wells

Each water well & filter provides a family and its immediate neighbors with easily accessible hand pumped clean water. Families can now grow a vegetable garden and raise chickens to increase their children's nourishment with fresh eggs, as well as sell them to neighbors. With clean water, families' health and hygiene improve dramatically. To date, we have provided over 250 water wells serving more than 1,000 people.

Many thanks to Karin Hurt & David Dye for providing over half these wells with your "Winning Well" program.

## **Family Story**

Before Mr. Touy Eourch received his own fresh water well, he fetched water from his neighbor's well which was a 20-minute walk. Due to the lack of clean water, his family regularly suffered from waterborne diseases causing health problems and financial hardship because they needed loans to get the necessary medical attention.

Thanks to the invaluable support of TWCCTW with Kforce Splash, the Eourch family now has their own well and no longer depends on other, possibly contaminated, water sources.



# Our latest projects include...

Starting four technology centers in Myanmar, Malaysia and Cambodia to teach marketable skills.

Over the past 5 years in Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia, we've partnered with Cisco, to develop a meaningful curriculum to enable 500 refugee children to go to school every day. The addition of the technology center offers them more practical skills.




### **Grants Given**

The graph below shows the money in US Dollars we raised thanks to you, our loyal contributors.





# PANDEMIC RELIEF PROJECTS

### **Angel Fund Project**

#### The Livelihood program

Provides working capital to help fund small businesses. The first 10 recipients who received the grant in Bacolod City, Philippines.

#### **The Rice Program**

Provides large sacks of rice, a food staple in the Philippines, to food insecure families. The rice is enough to help feed a family of five for a month. So families know that at least for a month, they will keep hunger at bay. Most grants were delivered in Luzon, Visayas, and Mindanao regions.

#### **Relief Assistance for Super Typhoon Odette**

Last December 25, 2021, our Together We Can Change The World volunteers delivered relief assistance consisting of water, packed meals for kids, fruits, and basic goods to several affected Barangays in Kabankalan City, Negros Occidental. Kabankalan is one of the many cities and municipalities in Southern Negros hard-hit by Typhoon Odette.

#### **Medical Missions**

On February 6, 2022, Together We Can Change The World volunteers, went to Sitio Ondol, Barangay Camugao, Kabankalan City, Negros Occidental, the area Typhoon Odette destroyed on December 17, 2021. The team consisted of a doctor, two pharmacists, and 11 volunteers. The team conducted a feeding program, a medical mission and distributed relief goods.
